Just 3km's from Dublin city centre, an area still considered the centre of Dublin, Riversdale House can be traced back to as early as 1730, though as records were destroyed, the original farmhouse could have been built earlier than this. The Gardens themselves are mainly mixed perennial borders with some rare trees and specimens such as the mature *Metrosideros excelsa*, a New Zealand tree that is remarkable to find growing and flowering in Ireland's climate.



The Dower House

The gardens surrounding this late eighteenth century house (c.1790) were laid out towards the end of the 19th century **and include a formal white garden**. Plantings of many fine specimens are to be found- *Rhododendron arboreum*, *Magnolia soulangeana* 'Alba' and *Camellia japonica* together with a number of specimen mature trees, including a fine Chilean myrtle, *Luma apiculata*, planted c.1880. **A wild meadow reaches its peak in June.**

Approached by an avenue of 200 year old beech trees Trudder Grange Garden has developed over the last 30 years from a stony field into a garden full of shrubs and herbaceous borders, an organic vegetable garden and with a greenhouse producing many varieties of tomatoes. There is an acre of wild flower meadow in the walled garden which is planted with unusual specimen trees.

Tyrrelstown House is situated on ten hectares of parkland and dates back to the 17th century. It has been home to the Wilkinson family since the late 1800s. Mark has inherited his father Keith's passion for trees, and has continued to develop a small arboretum on the parkland and Olive (following in Mark's mother Eleanor's footsteps) tends to the herbaceous borders in the walled garden.
